LIVE SHOWCASE & SALE QUALIFICATION:

1. Jr. Fair Members must qualify for the live showcase & sale through one of the following pathways.

a. Exhibit a Grand or Reserve Grand Champion market animal**.

b. Win Overall Senior or Junior Showman in their respective species**.

i. Equine live sale qualifiers include the winners of Overall Senior and Junior Versatility and Senior Showmanship Sweepstakes.

ii. Showmanship winners who win Grand or Reserve Grand market animal within the same species will only go through the ring with the winning animal, but the showmanship accomplishment will be announced and recognized.

c. Be a bona fide final year member in a market animal species.

i. This means it must be an exhibitor's final year of eligibility, not simply the final year they are planning to participate.

ii. Final year members wishing to participate in the Live Showcase & Sale must assist the Sale Committee in serving meals to buyers prior to the auction.

NO SERVICE=NO LIVE SALE.

d. Participate in the Dairy Products Basket or Dairy Goat Products Basket.

**If someone wins grand champion or reserve champion in their species - AND is champion junior or

senior showman in the SAME division - they will go through once for that species. However, they are eligible to go back through another time for a different species.

ONLINE PREMIUM SALE:

1. All Jr. Fair market animal exhibitors who complete their projects and exhibit at the fair are eligible for the online premium sale.
2. The online sale will begin no later than 8:00 am the Tuesday immediately following the fair and commence no earlier than 5:00 pm the Friday immediately following the fair.
3. This is an add-on only premium sale in which any buyer can participate.
4. Buyers must register through Fair Entry, which will host the sale, and can be accessed via the fair's website or by calling the Fair Office.

NON-LIVE SALE OPTIONS:

1. Sell (consign) to Sr. Fair Board for support price.
2. Remove animals from
3. All sale ring animals and those being consigned to the Fair Board will be loaded on trucks as trucks are available. Non-sale livestock will be released at 9 p.m. on Sunday including freezer meat.

EXCEPTION: Non-sale hogs are released at 9 p.m. Tuesday.

GENERAL RULES:

1. The Exhibitor is responsible for the care of his/her animal until it is released.
2. All sale animals will be identified. All cattle, goats, sheep, and swine will have ear tags. Rabbits will be tattooed.
3. All recipients of the livestock sales will be charged 2% of their gross check for administrative fees.
4. Only animals shown and judged at the Fair are eligible to be consigned. The committee reserves the right to cull animals of lesser quality to uphold the reputation of the sale.
5. The sale order will be determined and managed by the Livestock Sale committee.
6. All animals sold in the sale are to go to slaughter. All Grand Champions and Reserve Champions will be sold in the sale and will go to slaughter at a Fair Board designated slaughter facility. Exceptions are beef feeders, dairy feeders, rabbits, and poultry.
7. All animals consigned to sale must be sold at the auction and be bid off.
8. Each Exhibitor is responsible for selling his/her own project. If unable to be present at sale time, exhibitor must designate another Jr. Fair member to sell that animal. Only those animals

represented by the exhibitor or other designated person will be sold.

9. Premium checks for all sale animals will NOT be distributed on sale day. Exhibitors will receive notification when checks are available for pick up at the Fair Office. Advisors and Office staff may work together for group pickup.

10. All payments are due by Aug. 31, 2022. An interest charge will be charged on the balance due starting September 1, 2022. It will be at the rate of 2% per month, which is an annual rate of 24%.

11. All feeder sale animals must be paid for before leaving the grounds. You must show paid invoice to dept. superintendent before loading any animal.

12. Pictures will be taken of all champion exhibits for publicity purpose; however, each newspaper reserves the right to decide which pictures are published.

13. To simplify the bidding process, all buyers will bid on an Exhibitor's premium indicated by a dollar amount, minimum starting bid of \$100.00. Example: \$25-\$50-\$100-\$200-\$300 per animal. The buyer will strictly be providing a premium to the Exhibitor and not buying actual animals.

14. There will be no solicitation of bids inside the sale barn after the start of the sale.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS BY SPECIES

RABBIT SALE

1. All rabbits which are sold will be tattooed.

DAIRY PRODUCTS

1. Only Jr. Fair Dairy Exhibitors who are present at the sale (must sign in with Department Superintendent at sale ring) will share proceeds equally from the sale. Only 2 baskets of Dairy Products will be auctioned.

DAIRY GOAT PRODUCTS

1. Only Jr. Fair Dairy/Breeding Goat Exhibitors who are present at the sale (must sign in with Department Superintendent at sale ring) will share proceeds equally from the sale. Only 2 baskets of Dairy Goat Products will be auctioned.

SHEEP

1. The Ohio Sheep check off of 1/2% will be deducted from all members' checks who sell sheep at the fair.

SWINE

1. The National Pork check off of \$0.45 for each \$100 value of hogs sold will be deducted from all members' checks who sell hogs at the fair.

MARKET STEERS/MARKET HEIFER/DAIRY STEERS

1. Beef sold at the fair will have \$2.00 per head deducted and sent to the Ohio Beef Marketing Association for the promotion of beef.

BEEF FEEDERS (Steers & Heifer Calves)

1. All feeders will be sold to determine market price Saturday morning August 6th, 2022 starting at 10:00 am in the Pavilion show arena. Sale ring bids on Monday will be premium only.

2. A check-off of \$2.00 per head will be deducted from the Exhibitor's checks.

DAIRY FEEDERS

1. All feeders will be sold to determine support price Saturday morning August 6th, 2022 starting at 10:00

am in the Pavilion show arena. Sale ring bids on Monday will be premium only.

2. A check-off of \$2.00 per head will be deducted from Exhibitor's checks.

3. Up to \$10.00 will be deducted from sale proceeds to cover cost of vaccination shots given to feeders at May weigh-in.
