SECTION-A — FFA CROP AND GARDEN

Entry Rules

Where specific requirements are not indicated, entries are to be made according to instructions from your agricultural education instructor/FFA advisor.

FFA projects will not be interviewed, thus FFA members need not be present during judging.

All projects must be in place by 6:00 PM at the Junior Fair Building.

All entries must include a completed exhibit card which is furnished. All exhibits should be of presentable quality. Junior fair personnel in charge shall have the right, with the exhibitor's advisor's consent, not to display the exhibit.

All grain entries are the property of the fair and cannot be taken home.

Limit of 2 entries per exhibitor per class (except class 179).

Class (Premium for Exhibition \$2.50)

- 700 FFA Field Corn —10 ears, previous year's project
- 701 Shelled Corn — 1 quart jar of previous year's project
- 702 New Field Corn — 3 complete stalks, no root ball
- 703 Tallest Corn Stalk — no root ball
- 704 Soybeans — 1 quart jar of previous year's crop
- 705 New Soybeans — 3 complete stalks, including roots, no soil
- 706 Soybean Stalk with the most viable pods — 1 complete stalk including roots, no soil
- 707 Wheat — 1 quart jar, this year's crop
- 708 Oats — 1 quart jar, this year's crop
- 709 Other grain - 1 quart jar, this year's crop
- 710 Hay — Alfalfa, 1 bale slice, 6"-8" thick & tied
- 711 Hay — Clover, 1 bale slice, 6"-8" thick & tied
- 712 Hay - grass, 1 bale slice, 6"-8" thick & tied
- 713 Hay - mixed, 1 bale slice, 6"-8" thick & tied
- 714 Sugar Beets, 3 beets topped
- 715 Field Tomatoes for processing 1 peck
- 716 Field Pickles for processing 1 peck
- 717 Other Field Vegetable Crops
- 718 Fruit Project - exhibit 6 of the same variety or 1 quart berries
- 719 Vegetable Garden Project - the following are exhibit examples and number to show
 - Potatoes—5
 - Tomatoes—5
 - Cabbage—1
 - Sweet Corn—6
 - Beets, Red—3
 - Carrots—3

731 Agricultural Research Project - display showing the results of a research project conducted by a FFA member

732 Agricultural Research Project - display showing the results of a research project conducted by an Ag class in school

733 Agricultural Collection for Study - a collection of weeds, seeds, leaves, insects, etc. of at least 12 items nicely mounted

734 FFA Photo Display - 4 to 6 pictures with captions explaining a FFA activity project on poster board or equivalent material no larger than 16"x24".

735 SAE Photo Display - same procedure as 734.

SECTION-C - FFA MECHANICS PROJECTS

Entries in individual classes are to be made by all day agricultural students who are FFA members, from projects conducted during the current school year under the instruction of the local agricultural education instructor advisor.

Each item shall have attached a completed exhibit card which is furnished.

All individual projects will be judged on the following basis:

Construction and Workmanship	50%
Utility and adaptation to agricultural use	35%
Material and Finish	15%

Unworthy entries will not be displayed
