CAMPING REGULATIONS

- 1. The fee for a camping lot is \$200.00. Anyone reserving a camp lot must also purchase one membership or exhibitor ticket. Fees are due when reservations are made at the Fair Office.
- 2. Primitive camping lots are available for \$126 including one membership or exhibitor ticket. (40x70)
- 3. Executive camping lots with 50 amp hook up are available for \$300. Anyone reserving a camp lot must also purchase one membership or exhibitor ticket.(20x50)
- 4. All Golf Carts must be registered with the Fair Office and follow all Golf Cart/Gator Regulations.
- 5. Campers may reserve their same camping lot for the upcoming fair at the conclusion of the current fair to the last business day of February, by paying all camping fees in full. (Future camping prices are subject to change.)
- 6. Camping permits must be displayed and visible from the road at all times.
- 7. The Directors camping area is north of the F.O.P. Building. Once a Director leaves the Fair Board, they must leave the Directors camping area for the next Fair.
- 8. Each camping unit must include a supervisory adult.
- 9. Any camping unit to be occupied by a youth under 21 years old must be registered by their parent or legal guardian who will be responsible.
- 10. Loud noise, abusive language, large annoying parties, underage drinking, drugs, hazardous activities and any other annoyances will mean immediate eviction. No fees will be refunded.

11. Campfires:

- Permitted in camping areas only.
- Fair Board and Fire Marshals have the right to restrict any or all fires.
- Any campfire burning must always have a responsible adult present.
- Campfires are to be in a ring no larger than 20 inches in diameter. Flames can be no higher than 24 inches from the ground.
- All fires must be extinguished by 2:00 a.m.
- Campers must clean up ashes from the campfire after the fair. Anyone not complying will be subject to a fine.
- 12. All camping units must have adequate fire extinguishers.
- 13. Two (2) vehicular parking permits will be issued to each campsite. A MAXIMUM OF 2 VEHICLES ALLOWED PER CAMPING LOT IN NORTH CAMPING AREA. Extra vehicles should be parked north of the campgrounds NOT on vacant campsites.
- 14. Pursuant to O.R.C. 4511.681 Parking on Private Property Prohibited Acts: All campground roadways are considered fire lanes. Fire lanes are to be kept open at all times. NO EXCEPTIONS
- 15. Trash must be put in the proper containers provided for trash.
- 16. Anyone allowing any wastewater or sewage to be discharged on the grounds is subject to immediate eviction from the grounds.
- 17. A dump station is provided for all registered campers.
- 18. One camper trailer, tent, bus, or any other unit allowed per campsite.
- 19. One electric hookup permitted per lot. Must have 10 gauge drop cord, 3 prong plug.
- 20. Each camping unit will be **required** to have a back flow valve on the water hook up hose. Units are subject to be inspected by the camping committee and if the unit is found not in compliance, you will be given 24 hours to install one or the water will be turned off. Anyone failing to comply with these regulations will be asked to leave the grounds. All decisions are at the discretion of the camping committee.
- 21. No swimming pools, hot tubs, clothes lines, couches, overstuffed chairs, ice machines and/or extra appliances are permitted in the campground/camping areas.
- 22. No camping units allowed in Fair Grounds before Friday 8 a.m., July 28th, 2023.
- 23. ALL camping units must be removed by 8:00 p.m. Monday, August 7th, 2023.

- 24. A fee of \$40.00 per day will be charged for any camper that is in place before or after the above dates. Any camper that is on the grounds as of Wednesday, August 9th, 2023, will be towed at owner's expense. If fee is not paid before next year's camping privileges may be revoked.
- 25. No stakes are allowed to be driven into the ground unless approved by the camping committee prior to installation. If a water line is broken due to a stake being placed without permission, the camper will be responsible for all fees associated with fixing the water line.
- 26. Pets are not allowed in the Fairgrounds at any time. All pets will be restricted to campgrounds only and must be on a leash at all times. Failure to follow rules will result in pets removed from the grounds. Owners must clean up after pets.
- 27. The Society reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with, or incident to the Wood County Agricultural Society, and the right to amend or add to these rules as its judgment may determine. Any exhibitor who violates any of the rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and/or will be subject to such penalty as the Management may order.
