CLASS H - Special Displays

98. **Salad Bowl** – A bowl or container of whole vegetables suitable for a raw salad
99. **Vegetable Basket** - Display a basket of homegrown garden produce - Minimum of 8 vegetables.
100. **Patriotic Display** - Use vegetables and/or fruits to make an attractive display, container of your choice. Accessories and filler allowed.
101. **Rainbow Display** - Use vegetables and/or fruits in rainbow colors, container of your choice.
102. **Garden Scarecrow** (3'-6' tall)

CLASS J - Children-Only Displays

103. **Vegetable Plate** (for children 5-13 years) - Display 5 kinds of home grown vegetables on a plate.
104. **Vegetable Animal** (for children 5-13 years) - Make an animal out of vegetables and NAME it.
105. **Mr. Potato Head** (for children 5-13 years) - Create Mr. Potato Head using other items of their choice. Not to exceed 8x8 inches.
106. **Seed Picture** (for children 5-13 years).
107. **Decorated pumpkin** (for children 5-13 years) – Decorated pumpkin, not carved
